SUBJECT: 11.8. Race Starts – Rolling and Standing

EFFECTIVE DATE: March 9, 2008

EXISTING REGULATION (Paragraph 4, 5 and 6):

In such cases, drivers may only overtake to re-establish their original starting position prior to reaching the Start/Finish or designated Formation Line at the end of the first formation lap.

Any driver that does not re-establish their original starting position prior to reaching the Start/Finish or designated Formation Line at the end of the first formation lap must drop back, without interfering with other drivers, and start the race from the back of the grid.

Drivers may move up in their row to fill vacant spaces ahead of them after crossing the Start/Finish or designated Formation Line during the second formation lap. Karts may not move to an adjacent row to fill a vacant space.

NEW REGULATION (Paragraph 4, 5 and 6):

In such cases, drivers may only overtake to re-establish their original starting position prior to reaching the Start/Finish line at the end of the first formation lap or prior to reaching the designated Formation Line (if one used) during the second formation lap.

Any driver that does not re-establish their original starting position prior to reaching the Start/Finish line at the end of the first formation lap or prior to reaching the designated Formation Line (if one used) during the second formation lap must drop back, without interfering with other drivers, and start the race from the back of the grid.

Drivers may move up in their row to fill vacant spaces ahead of them after crossing the Start/Finish line at the end of the first formation lap or after reaching the designated Formation Line (if one used) during the second formation lap. Karts may not move to an adjacent row to fill a vacant space.
